

Jenny Oaks Baker is one of America's most accomplished classical violinists.

Whether her music is experienced live or



through one of her many recordings, it is impossible to escape the magic of her artistry.

Jenny began playing the violin at age four, and made her solo debut in 1983 when she was only eight years old.

She received her Master of Music degree from the renowned Juilliard School in New York City and her Bachelor's degree in violin performance from the Curtis Institute of Music in Philadelphia.

Jenny Oaks Baker has released eleven albums, selling nearly 200,000 copies since 1998, as a Shadow Mountain Records Artist. Her album Wish Upon a Star: A Tribute to the Music of Walt Disney earned a nomination for the 54th GRAMMY Awards for Best Pop Instrumental Album. Jenny's albums consistently chart on Billboard, with her 2010 album Then Sings My Soul hitting the #1 spot on the Top Classical Albums

chart two weeks in a row. Her newest album, Noël: Carols of Christmas Past, was produced and arranged by Emmy award winning composer Kurt Bestor and features former "Celtic Woman" star Alex Sharpe.

Jenny Oaks Baker's performance career is equally impressive. In April 1999, she made her Carnegie Hall debut as a featured soloist in the Easter Festival Concert. She will perform with the Pittsburgh Symphony this concert season at the invitation of the late Marvin Hamlisch, whom she soloed under multiple times. She has performed as a soloist in Alice Tully Hall at Lincoln Center, Strathmore Hall, Coolidge Auditorium at the Library of Congress, and the Kennedy Center.

Jenny has soloed with the National Symphony, Jerusalem Symphony, San Diego Symphony, Utah Symphony, Orchestra at Temple Square, and the internationally acclaimed Mormon Tabernacle Choir. She has also been featured in television and radio broadcasts nationwide. Her "In Performance" BYUTV Special Silver Screen Serenade features Jenny performing music from her album of the same name.

With her extensive performing and recording careers in addition to her superlative education, Jenny is an esteemed expert and served as a judge for the 2007 Stradivarius International Violin Competition. In April 2008 Governor Jon M. Huntsman Jr. of Utah awarded her the Governor's Mansion Artist Award for excellence in artistic expression.

For seven years, Jenny Oaks Baker performed as a first violinist in the National Symphony Orchestra before resigning in 2007 to devote more time to her young family. Jenny, her husband, and their four children reside outside of Washington D.C.



Alex Sharpe began her career at a tender age playing the coveted role of Dorothy in *The Wizard of Oz* at the Olympia Theatre in Dublin. This would mark the beginning of a long and enjoyable career in music theater.



She toured the United Kingdom and Scandinavia in the role of Eponine in Les Miserables for the Cameron Mackintosh Company and created the role of Bernadette for the Andrew Lloyd-

Webber/Ben Elton musical *The Beautiful Game*. Alex has sung with some of the world's most renowned orchestras, including the Icelandic Royal Philharmonic Orchestra, the Danish National Symphony, and the RTE Concert Orchestra. Her voice can be heard with Madonna's on the *Evita* film soundtrack. She has headlined a concert for the Prince's Trust in the Mayflower Theatre, England, and in 2006 she recorded the demo of *The Pirate Queen* and was asked by Claude Michel Schonberg and Alain Boublil (*Les Miserables*) to perform at the press launch in Chacago.

In 2008 Alex joined Celtic Woman, an all-female vocal ensemble, and began a three-year tour of the United States, performing live on Dancing with the Stars, The Today Show, Good Morning America and for President Obama at the national Christmas tree lighting. That same year, she recorded the Emmy-nominated DVD and album, Songs from the Heart. In August of this year, Alex was honored to be invited to solo on Jenny Oaks Baker's Christmas album, Noël: Carols of Christmas Past, and is delighted to be a part of the 25th anniversary of A Kurt Bestor Christmas.

Helen McCurdy Berrett, mezzosoprano, holds a degree in music from Brigham Young University, where she received many scholarships and was named the Gladys Marie Laurent Outstanding Vocalist. At BYU, she sang with the University Singers and Concert Choir and played viola with the Philharmonic Orchestra and the Chamber Orchestra. Helen has toured Europe with the Mid-America Band



and Choir and held leads in numerous opera and community theater productions. She has won awards in NATS competitions, the Utah Opera Young Singers Competition, and at the Utah State Fair. As

a teacher, she has taught choir and orchestra in the public schools and served as adjunct faculty at Utah State University and Western Wyoming Community College, in addition to maintaining a private voice studio. She has directed many church and community choirs and soloed with community orchestras in *Handel's Messiah* in Denver, Seattle, and Provo.
